Hobomock State "A" Champions After Four Overtimes

fter four overtime periods Hobomock defeated the Nighthawk Seniors 3-4 in the State "A" finals. The Nighthawks played brilliantly during the States and were able to tie Hobomock's record. Though both teams had already assured themselves a spot in the Nationals, a "play-off" style game was played to determine a State Champion.

The game went on for over two and a half hours. Fans thought Michelle Meznic, the Nighthawk goaltender, played brilliantly, especially in the overtime periods. Hobomock took its ominous offensive strength and kept banging away at the Nighthawk end. But the South Shore League Regular Season Champions just couldn't bury the Nighthawks.

Finally, in the fourth overtime, 16-year-old Erin Metcalf (5) scored perhaps her most important goal of her young career. When Meznic saw the Hobomock forces cross the blue line, she said she hoped the play was off-sides, but there was no whistle. The Hobomock combination was simply not meant to be stopped this time. When the puck finally crossed the goal line Hobomock became, once again, the state's champions.

Both teams will leave for Michigan to play in the Nationals the week of April 7-10. The World Cup games are being played around that time, however, making it impossible for World Cup players to come back and help their regular teams. Hobomock has two players on the World Cup; Beth Beagan (20) and Collene Coyne (7). The Nighthawks have no World Cup players.

Coyne, who broke her jaw in the play-offs two weeks ago against the Nighthawks, was not available for the States. Coach Jim Wagner said she is on a diet of "potatoes and ice cream." She is wearing a plate but will be available for the World Cup Games. Wagner said Coyne is quite a athlete. She was invited to pitch baseballs with the "Silver Bullets," a women's professional ball team. For the World Cup Coyne will be wearing a "Juneau style" jaw guard.
