# League Goes With Three Divisions

he league will move from having two divisions to three this week.

Previously the league had two divisions, Gold and Silver, and divided into a third Bronze division only during play-offs.

At last Tuesday's league meeting President Paula Dumart explained how the divisions will be set up for the remainder of the year. She said the league used the standings as of December 4 as a guide to create the three categories.

Hobomock, Canton, Nighthawks A, Assabet A, Needham, North Shore, Assabet Midgets and Mass Bay all made the cut for the upper or Gold Division. The Silver Division will include Chelmsford, Springfield, Nighthawks B, Stoneham B, Quincy and Rhode Island Seniors.

The new third division or Bronze Division will include South Shore, Randolph, Boston, Rhode Island Midgets, Framingham, and The Storm.

Over the past few years the team that finished first in the lower division moved to the upper division. The team that finished last in the upper division moved down. This year the teams will stay where they are at least until next season.

'This is your schedule for the full year people,' Dumart said indicating the grid-style schedule Val Hampton of Canton created. 'We now have twenty teams. If we moved you up and down the scheduling would be a nightmare."

Though it does kill some incentive for teams to be first in their division or, in some cases, try to keep from being last, **Dumart** said the way the divisions are set up is still open for debate. "You can come to us and tell us why you think your team should be moved up or moved down."

Dumart said that conversation won't take place until the summer. That's when this year's accumulated points can serve as a good justification for moving a team to another level next year.

### **Team Schedule**

he schedule for the remainder of the year was passed out at Tuesday's league meeting. For now on the games that take place in Canton start at 4:50 P.M. However, President Paula Dumart assured those present that the league has not given up its premium early Sunday

afternoon ice. Instead she said the league is 'investing in its fut ure' by giving the ice to developing Squirt and Pee Wee girls. She said there are now 14 teams with girls 15 and under in the area that need ice-time.

# **Round One Ends**

Though Hobomock had some big roster changes over the summer it still holds its dynasty status by being the only team in the league to complete this round without a loss.

Hobomock grabbed first place this round in the Gold Division with 16 points. Canton and Nighthawks A tied for second place with 15 points. Assabet A, a new team to the league this year, came in third with 13 points.

In the Silver Division formally battered Nighthawks B took first place with 15 points. Stoneham B and Quincy tied for second. The Rhode Island Seniors, which usually battled for first place each round last year, came in third.

Randolph, also usually a contender for first-place in the Silver ended the round in 6th place, one place below the rookie South Shore midget team. The status placed Randolph in the Bronze division for the rest of the season. (Randolph lost two points last week when their team forfeited due to some misunderstanding on directions to the Marlboro rink.)

Framingham is also having a better year. Not only has the team scraped itself off the bottom of the financial barrel by paying off last year's financial debt to the league (though they still have this year to go), they have also risen from the bottom of the points barrel. The team, which consistently finished last each round last year, had three wins for six points this round—that ties the Rhode Island Midget team!

The title holder for the bottom this round is **The Storm**, a distant cousin of **Framingham's**. However it is a new team and like any storm it may be difficult to predict what it will be capable of doing in the future.

# All-Star Game Gets Fancy

This year All-Star players from the Gold, Silver and Bronze Division will have preassigned numbers and names on their shirts. There will also be a program describing the players' attributes. To help add to the celebration the ceremonies will open with a live rendition of the national anthem.

The All-Star Game will be on January 21 at the Marlboro rink. The event is early this year to avoid tournament conflicts which take place in March.
